

Dr. Paul R. Dommermuth



Born in 1935, in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, Dr. Paul R. Dommermuth escaped his birthplace before the Italian invasion in 1936 with his adoptive mother, Bertha Dommermuth and Aunt Ruth Shippey. The family settled in Avoca, Pennsylvania.

In 1969, Dr. Dommermuth accepted a position in the State University College at Fredonia sociology department. He retired in 2000.

Dr. Dommermuth was the Chautauqua County Mental Health Commissioner, served on the advisory board of the Chautauqua County Home, was a member of the Community Services Board and chairman of its Mental Health Subcommittee. He was a Salvation Army volunteer serving as a board member and bell ringer.

Dr. Dommermuth died on November 18, 2011; however, his commitment to this community will live on through his bequest to the Northern Chautauqua Community Foundation. This area he called home will continue to benefit from his unrestricted endowment through NCCF's Community Grant Program.

Boys & Girls Club of NCC Agency Endowment Fund
